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## About This Manual

This manual is designed to help you prepare your application for the Stage IX Residency for Immersive Arts & Research. It walks you through each section of the online registration form, listing every question you will encounter.

The form is divided into five sections:

1. Basic Info — Your personal details
2. Residency Track — Choose between Emerging and Established Artist tracks
3. Artistic Profile & Motivation — Your practice, interests, and reasons for applying
4. Research/Project Proposal — Your research questions, project vision, and presentation ideas
5. Portfolio & Supporting Materials — CV, portfolio, links, and technical requirements

 **TIP:** We strongly recommend preparing your longer answers (especially Part 4: Research/Project Proposal) in a separate document first, then copying them into the online form. The form does not save drafts automatically.

## **Applying as a Duo**

*Options: No / Yes. The residency allows applications from individual artists or duos. If you apply as a duo, the resources (artist fee and R&D budget) will be shared between both members.*

## Section 3: Artistic Profile & Motivation

This section asks about who you are as an artist, how you relate to immersive work, and why Stage IX is relevant to you right now. Take time to reflect on these questions — the selection committee is looking for authenticity, curiosity, and a sense of where you want to go.

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## Section 4: Research/Project Proposal

This is the most substantial section of the application. It consists of three parts covering your research questions, your project vision, and your ideas for presentation and sharing. Prepare these answers carefully beforehand.

 **TIP:** Parts 1 and 2 each allow up to 3,600 characters. Part 3 allows up to 1,800 characters. We strongly advise drafting these in a separate document and pasting them into the form.

### Part 1: Your Questions \*

*Consider these questions while submitting your answer:*

- **What do you want to find out?** What questions are driving you? What don't you know yet? What territory do you want to explore?
- **Why do you want to find it out?** What's at stake—for you, for your practice, for the field? Why does this matter now?
- **Why you?** What in your background, experience, or artistic practice positions you to pursue this inquiry? What do you bring to these questions?
- **For whom?** Who might be interested in what you discover? Fellow artists and makers? Audiences? Researchers? Specific communities? How might the knowledge you generate be valuable beyond your own practice?
- **How do you imagine finding out?** What approaches, methods, or ways of working do you want to employ? This doesn't need to be fixed—we're interested in your instincts and intentions.

### Part 2: The Project \*

*Consider these questions while submitting your answer. Remember: this is a vessel for your questions, not a fixed plan. We expect it to evolve.*

- **Starting Point.** What is your basis? What preceded this? What existing work, research, or experiments does this build on?
- **Project Description.** Describe what you imagine making, testing, or developing. What form(s) might this take? What experiments do you want to run?
- **Facilities and technologies.** Which consortium facilities and technologies are most relevant to your research? Be specific where you can. What do you already know and want to deepen? What is new to you and you want to explore?

- **Beyond your current toolbox.** What would you love to experiment with that you haven't had the opportunity for before? Think broadly: technologies, techniques, collaborations, types of audiences, presentation formats, venues, ways of working...
- **Collaborators and support.** Who would you like to work with or learn from? What kind of support do you anticipate needing from your team (producer, dramaturg, mentor, documentalist)?

### Part 3: Presentation and Sharing \*

*Consider these questions while submitting your answer:*

- **What kind of presentation space are you imagining?** Physical, hybrid, virtual? Intimate or large-scale? How do you see the work meeting an audience?
- **Documentation and knowledge sharing.** How do you typically document your process? How open are you to sharing work-in-progress publicly? What forms of documentation feel natural to you?
- **What do you hope to have at the end?** Not as a deliverable requirement—but as a personal horizon. A prototype? New questions? A network? Skills? Something else?

## Section 5: Portfolio & Supporting Materials

The final section asks you to upload your CV and portfolio, and optionally provide links to additional work and any technical requirements.

### Portfolio & CV (Required)

Upload a single PDF file containing:

- **CV:** maximum 2 pages
- **Portfolio:** maximum 10 pages

 **TIP:** If your portfolio is a showreel or needs to be presented in a dynamic format (video, interactive, etc.), post a link in the “Links to other Relevant Work” section below and provide an explanation in the Technical Rider / Requirements section.

### Links to Other Relevant Work (Optional)

You can provide up to 3 links to additional work, such as showreels, playthroughs, video registrations, or online projects. Use this section if you want to share work that goes beyond a static PDF portfolio.

## Application Checklist

Before you submit, make sure you have everything ready:

- Personal details completed (name, pronouns, email, phone, website)
- Legal address in the Netherlands confirmed (or explanation provided)
- Residency track selected and justified (max. 600 characters)
- Artistic Profile & Motivation questions answered (4 text fields + 1 multiple choice + 1 text field)
- Part 1: Your Questions written (max. 3,600 characters)
- Part 2: The Project written (max. 3,600 characters)
- Part 3: Presentation and Sharing written (max. 1,800 characters)
- CV and Portfolio PDF prepared (CV max. 2 pages, Portfolio max. 10 pages)
- Optional: Links to showreels, videos, or other dynamic work
- Optional: Technical requirements for viewing portfolio materials
